- 00:06:12 After we watched our daughter Grace Diane Facetime,
- 00:06:17 I um I immediately felt that I needed to go to the
- hospital even though I was still pretty sick and
- 00:06:24 I met Jessica and our pastor there and, um,
- 00:06:30 while we're in the room, we just cannot let us spend a few moments just with grace alone. And it was,
- 00:06:39 it was just a horrific, um, sight to come upon. It was natural. Her daughter, Grace was now gone. Um,
- 00:06:49 the emotions that came over the top of our minds and just our physical bodies were just unbelief.
- 00:06:59 Yeah, we took her bipap off. It was still on this open prayers that somehow she was, that was gone.
- 00:07:08 And as soon as we did that, the color of race change and um, we had to accept what she was truly God.
- 00:07:18 Ok. The nurse came in and started to clean grease up and so on after we had had it pulled off all
- 00:07:27 the markers off her because I didn't want any of that stuff on her anymore. So, but in a terrific
- 00:07:32 place and often we took everything off all the weeds and stuff and the nurse came and said she had
- 00:07:38 to start getting w cleaned up and it just, um, and there's a bomb that takes your breath away
- 00:07:48 because you have to watch them,
- 00:07:51 put a toe tag on and put your hands in a body bag.
- 00:08:04 So I want to set the record straight regarding why I
- called Grace's Death murder. And if those of
- 00:08:11 you who have been following me and you can look back at the interviews, you'll notice that I didn't
- 00:08:15 start calling Grace's Death murder until April and people were interviewing me all the way back to
- 00:08:21 December. Most of the hosts were calling Grace's Death murder in January. We had an intensivist who
- 00:08:27 said the meds killed your daughter in November. So November the month after Grace died, the doctor

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00:08:32 who helped me review the records even said there's no question as to an intention. That's how
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- 00:08:38 egregious the records look. But my standard was different than everybody's because I answer to God.
- 00:08:44 And so I needed to invest the time myself going through these records. So once April came around, I
- 00:08:49 had about 500 hours of research into Grace's records. And that's when I started calling Grace's
- 00:08:56 death murder when I've been interviewed. And so I want to just go through some details as to why I
- 00:09:01 say that. So the first one has to do with the package insert for Precedex. Grace was on Precedex for
- 00:09:06 4.5 days, four full days before her last day. And the Precedex package insert, these are the rules
- 00:09:13 that they are supposed to follow says specifically to not use this drug for more than 24 hours. And
- 00:09:21 it because it causes adverse reactions. Those adverse reactions include acute respiratory distress
- 00:09:27 syndrome, respiratory failure and agitation. So they use Precedex for agitation yet it causes
- 00:09:34 agitation. So then they bump up the rate and in Grace's case, they started her at a a very low dose
- 00:09:41  $\,$  which we found out upon reviewing the records and then on her last day, they increased it to 14  $\,$
- 00:09:46 times that dose. When we didn't have advocacy, they increased the dose seven different times of this
- 00:09:52 drug that they're not supposed to be using for more than 24 hours. On her death certificate, they
- 00:09:57 told the truth relative to the first cause of Grace's death, which was acute respiratory failure
- 00:10:03 with hypoxemia that is directly caused by using prox more than the 24 hours that's indicated on the
- 00:10:09 package insert. So that's the first thing. The second thing is the drug combination. So I knew the
- 00:10:14 drug combination early on. She was given prosodic LORazepam and morphine in a 29 minute window.
- 00:10:20 That's why the intensivist said the meds killed your daughter. OK. So then that wasn't enough for me
- 00:10:26 to be convinced that she was murdered until I dug into how could this possibly happen? And I found
- 00:10:32 out that not only did the doctor have to order the meds, which is obvious, but the pharmacist for
- 00:10:37 the hospital had to sign off on the order because the meds are contraindicated. According to the

- 00:10:42 package insert for morphine, the alarm had to be overridden. And then the nurse in charge of Grace's
- 00:10:48 care the last day had 14 years of ICU experience. So she had to have known better. So that
- 00:10:55 combination really got me to the point of seeing my gosh, I think Grace was murdered. And I want to
- 00:11:01 just review the morphine package insert. So you understand what I'm talking about. There's a, a
- 00:11:06 warning label inside the package insert itself. It's called the black box warning. These are the
- 00:11:12 biggies. So it says that for one, the patient is supposed to be monitored closely after they gave
- 00:11:19 Grace morphine, not one doctor or nurse stepped foot into Grace's room, they just left her there to
- 00:11:25 die. When Jessica felt grace getting cold, she asked the nurses to come in and help. They refused,
- 00:11:32 they just said cover her with a blanket. This is normal. The black box. Furthermore, for the
- 00:11:38 morphine package insert says that you're not supposed to combine those three meds because they cause
- 00:11:45 respiratory depression, coma and death. And then furthermore, and again on the same package insert,
- 00:11:52 they're supposed to have the reversal drug immediately available. They didn't have any of that. So
- 00:12:00 now we get to Grace's last moments on this earth and that's when we find out the doctor put a do not
- 00:12:08 resuscitate order on her. So then when we beg the nurses to save Grace's life, they refused to even
- 00:12:15 come in the room. We found out in looking at the records after the fact that the nr order was put on
- 00:12:23 Grace eight minutes after increasing the dose of Precedex to 14 times the dose from 4.5 days earlier.
- 00:12:31 And then the final piece of this equation is after we talk with Jessica the evening of Grace's death.
- 00:12:39 Jessica was in the room. She said dad, there was an armed guard posted outside the room so you add
- 00:12:46 all these things together. And that's why I'm calling Grace's death murder. I'm not waiting for a
- 00:12:51 court. You know, a court does not in pursuit of the truth. I am in pursuit of the truth. Praise God
- 00:12:58 and I have a responsibility to make sure before I go spouting off and calling something that isn't
- 00:13:06 true truth that I have to prove it beyond a shadow of a doubt. And I hope by me explaining that you

- 00:13:13 understand why I'm calling Grace's death murder. Thank you for listening. Today marks one year since
- 00:13:21 Grace was murdered in a hospital. Saint Elizabeth in Appleton, Wisconsin by hospital staff. She was
- 00:13:29 taken from us by government incentivized evil agendas to depopulate the world. Her life was deemed
- 00:13:36 not worthy of living. Grace was ushered into heaven as she took her final breath. And her death was
- 00:13:43 called at 7:27 p.m. on October 13th 2021. She was a daughter, sister, aunt, sister-in-law, niece,
- 00:13:54 cousin and friend. We all love and miss you more than words could ever explain. We are completely
- 00:14:01 shattered. We are so very sorry. We didn't know there was an agenda. We didn't see what they were
- 00:14:07 doing to you. We trusted the White coat. The list goes on. We'd give anything for a redo and we
- 00:14:15 would make completely different decisions. We never had admitted you to a hospital in the first
- 00:14:21 place. We didn't know what we now know today. And for all of this, we can't apologize enough. It was
- 00:14:28 the doctors and nurses who murdered you, but it hurts. We were the ones to put you in that killing
- 00:14:34 field hospital not knowing they were only there to take your life. Hospitals are to help people not
- 00:14:41 murder them. So when we started this, this process with grace getting COVID, you know, first you,
- 00:14:50 you know, what was the, the mindset, you know, the the indoctrination or the the propaganda relative
- 00:14:57 to COVID? You know, as I think about it, it it's, it influenced me, but we would have never thought
- 00:15:04 in a million years that a hospital was bad.
- 00:15:18 Very few countries in the world lost more people to Coronavirus than New York did and no states lost
- 00:15:24 more in the United States. How exactly did that happen? It's a question that needs a serious answer.
- 00:15:31 Many people died finding out seems of no interest whatsoever to the press. They'd rather shame
- 00:15:37 people for visiting the beach. Erin Marie Olszewski is a nurse. She spent almost a month working in
- 00:15:43 New York's Elmhurst Hospital. That was the epicenter of the Coronavirus outbreak in the state. She
- 00:15:48 was so shocked by what she saw that she began to collect undercover footage of what was happening
- 00:15:52 around her. This patient is in with like a non COVID. I don't, I don't understand why they're doing

- 00:15:59 that. I know there's four patients in a row here
- 00:16:05 and this is supposed to be the COVID year seventh floor.
- They shut it down. They are going to have
- 00:16:12 non COVID there. This is going to be the only COVID. So they shouldn't put any non COVID here.
- 00:16:18 That's what they've been doing. The guy over in 29. I had him upstairs because I was on CC before it
- 00:16:26 and he came in with a stroke. I know that's what 26 1 was a stroke and no COVID and now he's got
- 00:16:35 COVID and he's out of it because we gave it to him here.
- 00:16:42 Aaron Ossy is the author of the forthcoming book, The Undercover Epicenter Nurse. She joins us
- 00:16:48 tonight. Erin. Thanks so much for coming on. Thank you for doing this. The insides of Well, thank
- 00:16:53 you for having me. So tell us what we just saw, explain the video we played if you wish. Um Well,
- 00:16:59 this was a pretty common occurrence and the video shows COVID and non COVID being housed in the same
- 00:17:06 floor um sometimes in the same rooms um which is ultimately creating, you know, hospital acquired
- 00:17:12 infections of COVID. It's nosocomial infections. So, you know, people will be admitted without COVID
- 00:17:19 or, and they will end up getting COVID. Sometimes they'll be awaiting their tests, which would take
- 00:17:25 anywhere from 5 to 10 days to see if they had COVID and be admitted to these floors while they
- 00:17:31 waited. That's just, that is shocking and I'm just so glad that you got video of it. I mean, this
- 00:17:37 was happening at the same time. The rest of us weren't allowed to go outside for fears that we would
- 00:17:41 spread the Coronavirus to one another. How could this happen in a hospital where people have
- 00:17:46 weakened immune systems? Um, I, I like those answers. Um I've been asking them and nobody seems to
- 00:17:53 really have those answers. I don't know who the authority is. That's what I'm always referred to. Um,
- 00:17:59 part of this I think came from Governor Cuomo's executive order that he did on March 23rd, 2020. Um,
- 00:18:06 you know, removing essentially all liability from all medical professionals, um banning the
- 00:18:13 hydroxychloroquine, um not allowing family into these, you know, hospitals in order to advocate for
- 00:18:18 their patients. So there's a lot of different things that happened that really created this problem.

- 00:18:25 It's so interesting that you mentioned not allowing family in to advocate for their relatives. That
- 00:18:31  $\,$  was a factor in this. It sounds like it's a huge factor and that's what I'm having a really hard
- 00:18:37 time with because nurses, we're supposed to be reporting, you know, anything that we see unethical.
- 00:18:43 It's part of our job and without family in the rooms, we are the patient's eyes, ears and everything,
- 00:18:50 we have to make sure that the patients are being treated properly. Um, anybody and, and you know,
- 00:18:56 any nurse or anyone that would question anything would be sent home. I was one of them. Um, and
- 00:19:03 nobody ever wanted any of this out. And I, you know, it's all hearsay if you don't have proof. So I
- 00:19:11 needed to get the proof. So, because it is so absolutely unbelievable that without it, you know,
- 00:19:17 people couldn't even fathom this. I think this is, I think this is a scandal. I don't use that word
- 00:19:23 lightly. You were sent home for complaining about a policy of putting COVID patients with people who
- 00:19:30 weren't infected. That's shocking. Correct for asking questions. They would tell us that, you know,
- 00:19:36 be good behave. Um, don't ask any of these questions, um, or you're gonna be sent home and I have
- 00:19:42 recording of that as well. Um, you know, I was there for just under a month, so a lot of this is all
- 00:19:50 well documented. Yeah, it certainly is. And if it wasn't, no one would believe you, everything that
- 00:19:57 has happened. Um, since the very, very beginning has all been based on fear tactics because they can
- 00:20:08 create whatever type of public health emergency and put the fear into the people so that people will
- 00:20:17 comply because nobody wants to be sick and nobody, nobody wants to die. You know, but that's how
- 00:20:25 they were, that's how they did it. You know, that's how they were able to
- 00:20:31 get to where we are. I guess today they kicked out all the family members. And first of all that,
- 00:20:39 that should never happen, it should never ever happen again. Um That was very confusing to me
- 00:20:48 because as a nurse, if I can gown up and put on the mask, put on all the P pe and then leave the
- 00:20:55 hospital, we were allowed to go to Walgreens and Target and CV S that were all open around, you know,

- 00:21:02 Times Square while everybody else and their family members is banned and sent home, sometimes they
- 00:21:09 put restraining orders on family members because they wanted to come in. That was, that's a huge
- 00:21:14 issue. Um That was a big red flag because without a family member to advocate for you, what do you
- 00:21:21 have? You have a nurse, right? I mean, a nurse's job is to be the patient's advocate. But if you
- 00:21:27 have nurses that are unwilling to advocate for their patient because they're more concerned about
- 00:21:31 their paychecks, then this is, this is where um things went very, very south and not in the
- 00:21:39 patient's favor. I'm a pediatrician. I've, I've practiced for over 20 years and I want to be clear
- 00:21:45 that the viewpoints and opinions that I expressed today are strictly my own. I am not here
- 00:21:51 representing any employer, past or present or any other entity. The fear there was so much fear that
- 00:21:58 was instilled in people. I had people coming into the office in the first weeks of this, uh this,
- 00:22:05 you know, pandemic being announced, I had kids in the office that were looking at me with terror,
- 00:22:11 just terrified with a fever and a cough and they looked at me and they said to me, am I going to die?
- 00:22:18 And they were like seven or eight or nine years old that the terror and the fear that was instilled
- 00:22:22 in these Children was I would go home and cry
- 00:22:31 in the process of strapping grace down to the bed 1048 that morning, they had grace on a dose of
- 00:22:38 protex that was 14 times the dose they started her on 48. Earlier. At that point, we believe based
- 00:22:48 on another piece of the records that we now have, that they thought that that was gonna take her
- 00:22:55 hold. So even to be advocating for your patient against certain medications that they were trying to
- 00:23:04 give or certain medications that they were withholding, which is another red flag. At that point, we
- 00:23:10 didn't really know much about Ivermectin, but we did know about the hydroxychloroquine. Um I had
- 00:23:16 been using that outside in the er, at our hospital in Florida which where it wasn't banned. So that
- 00:23:23 was another issue. Why are we not utilizing all of these resources? And they were relying on the
- 00:23:29 experts who were not in the hospitals. Um So I made that argument quite a few times with, uh, you

- 00:23:36 know, doctors that I was working with there, you know, like we are the experts essentially like
- 00:23:42 we're, we're literally at the epicenter of the epicenter. We know that what you guys are, we know
- 00:23:48 what is happening is killing all of these patients. Why can't we try something else? And it was
- 00:23:53 always that nothing else works. But I know it. I knew it did. So that was another red, you know,
- 00:23:59 another red flag and then just like the IV poles all the way outside of the patients rooms, nurses,
- 00:24:06 doctors were too scared to even go in and even assess the patients. I don't know if I ever saw a
- 00:24:11 stethoscope there where anyone was actually listening to anybody's lungs. Um I walked, I was
- 00:24:19 assigned to patients when I got to the rooms, they had feces up their backs for at least 23 weeks.
- 00:24:24 You know that just the pure just gross negligence, medical malpractice just like just no humanity.
- 00:24:34 Um They, any patients that were that walk through the doors at Elmhurst at were as pretty much
- 00:24:41 assigned to their death. So they were assumed dead before they were even dead. Grace was
- 00:24:48 specifically given three contraindicated meds in 29 minutes. Prosodic F, LORazepam and morphine, a
- 00:24:56 combination of meds and an amount that no one would have survived. Grace also had an illegal DNR do
- 00:25:03 not resuscitate order, put on her life without family knowledge or consent. Hospitals are using end
- 00:25:11 of life meds without informed consent to people, not at the end of their life along with illegal
- 00:25:17  $\,$  DNRS. They are also using other COVID protocols such as Rem de Zevi equaling run death is near
- 00:25:25 ventilators and many other deadly meds to accomplish their agenda. Greece's story is not an anomaly,
- 00:25:33 this is happening all around the world
- 00:25:41 protocols that are now being increasingly driven by the administrators in the hospital and not by
- 00:25:47 the physicians. And what I mean by that is, is this and I actually give a completely different
- 00:25:52 example to help people try to understand this, pretend like you're getting on an airplane and you're
- 00:25:57 on an airplane and your pilot is flying the plane and it's on autopilot and things are going well
- 00:26:03 and you're having a happy flight and all of a sudden you hit some turbulence and things are really

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00:26:09 scary and your plane starts to fall from the sky and things are happening that are terrifying. It's
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- 00:26:15 important for that pilot to be able to take over the controls of the plane and to fly that plane if
- 00:26:21 they need to, to fly it manually. And that's the same type of thing with medical care. You know,
- 00:26:27 what are we as physicians? We are experienced clinicians who understand that each patient is not a
- 00:26:34 carbon copy of the one that came before each patient is an individual human being. And sometimes the
- 00:26:40 protocols aren't the right thing for that particular patient. So sometimes the autopilot type
- 00:26:45 protocol in a hospital may work for a patient and other times, it really just does not. And we've
- 00:26:53 increasingly tied the hands of physicians so they can no longer do what we're, we're trained to do
- 00:26:59 and take care of that individual patient in front of us. And that is what is really terrifying about
- 00:27:05 these protocols is it's become, it's gotten to the point in many hospitals where we're hearing from,
- 00:27:10 from other physicians who are saying, you know, I can no longer take care of the patient in the best
- 00:27:15 way in the way that I was trained to take care of this patient. Uh because my hands are tied by
- 00:27:22 these, these rules that have been put in place. And so I would ask you this in those kind of
- 00:27:27 situations, who is actually caring for that patient. Is it actually the physician who has the
- 00:27:31 training or is it the administrator or whoever the untrained medical, they're not even a medical
- 00:27:40 professional, whoever the untrained person is, who's requiring that these protocols be followed,
- 00:27:44 that's who's providing the care. And that's really similar to saying, you know, my pilot is no
- 00:27:49 longer flying the plane. It's just some guy from administration who's in the cockpit trying to tell
- 00:27:55 me what to do and is trying to take over the controls at 1056 that morning, eight minutes after this
- 00:28:00 press is at 14 times the doors, they put an illegal do not resuscitate order in Greece. Of course,
- 00:28:08 we had no idea but the timing of only being eight minutes afterward is so egregious. It makes sense
- 00:28:19 that they thought the pros was going to take her out, going back to the DNR. They do not resuscitate.

- 00:28:25 We had no knowledge or consent until when we were asking them to save her. And even if ad nr was put
- 00:28:32 on Gras, if the family says to save their loved one, those doctors and nurses are to save, they do
- 00:28:40 everything they can to save that person. And then when we were screening for them to save her, no
- 00:28:46 old doctor and nursed at foot, ning, they all stayed stationary in that hallway. My dad's yelling at
- 00:28:52 them to reverse what they did. My mom's screaming to save our little girl. We're not seeing her
- 00:28:56 because she has Down Syndrome and not one person is that put in that room. How can you do that? How
- 00:29:03 can you allow an innocent person? A child? She's only 19 years old, die in front of your eyes. I
- 00:29:12 don't care if you've gotten cold, you trained your mind. You don't do that. If you're human, you
- 00:29:19 don't do that.
- 00:29:22 Informed consent is such a foundation of medicine. It's what, it's what the ethics of medicine is,
- 00:29:30 is built upon, right? We have to have informed consent or we don't have a society any longer. I'll
- 00:29:38 just, that's how I'm going to phrase it and to give to have an informed consent discussion with
- 00:29:45 parents, it means that the parent has to be informed and they have to give consent and that may seem
- 00:29:53 really simple, but we've tangled it all up and in the last three years we've just seen it erode away.
- 00:29:59 So to be informed, a parent really needs to understand what the risks and benefits are for a
- 00:30:05 particular procedure or intervention, not, not for society as a whole, but for their child, what
- 00:30:12 they have to be informed about what may happen to their child. And, and we can't always get into
- 00:30:16 every little tiny detail of what may happen, but we need to give them, we need to give parents a
- 00:30:22 reasonable understanding of what the risks are of a procedure and then what the benefits are and to
- 00:30:28 give consent, a parent needs to do that without being pressured. So a parent needs to, to not be
- 00:30:36 forced to do something, they need to not consent to something because there's an incentive because
- 00:30:41 someone, you know, has given them something to have their child undergo a procedure uh because they
- 00:30:47 uh have been threatened because they've been bullied into doing something that's not consent.

- 00:30:53 Consent has to be of someone's own free will. And so really, we have to make sure that we're having
- 00:30:59 informed consent discussions with families about anything that has the potential for having risk.
- 00:31:05 And, and that's pretty much any procedure or intervention in medicine.
- 00:31:15 What we're walking through now is Grace's last day on earth, which was October 13th of 2021 that day
- 00:31:23 started with a phone call from the doctor. He called Cindy and I at home and the purpose of the call
- 00:31:29 was to follow up on a call that he had with us the evening before on the 12th. And the purpose of
- 00:31:36 that call was to walk us through a pre authorization for a ventilator. Yeah. And so
- 00:31:43 preauthorizations, Cindy and I would have pre-approved putting grace on a ventilator just in case
- 00:31:50 and just in case meant that when the hospital decided that Grace would need a ventilator. Well, we
- 00:31:56 already knew that grace was, she never needed a ventilator. And it's, it's the kiss of death. So we
- 00:32:03 already knew we weren't going to do that, but he called to try to convince us one last time on the
- 00:32:08 12. And so then he followed up on the 13th asking for a decision and we said no. And my, my personal
- 00:32:17 uh theory with why Grace died on the 13th that day is because we said no. And that meant that they
- 00:32:26 knew they weren't going to convince us to put grace on a ventilator. That means the money was going
- 00:32:33 to dry up. They had to have the money. And when you follow the money trail all the way through, you
- 00:32:39 see that a ventilator is about a \$300,000 decision. And I know based on my own research relative to
- 00:32:47 that day in the hospital that they had higher paying patients in the emergency room. So as Cindy has
- 00:32:54 pointed out after we connected the dots, that grace was worth more dead than alive. And so I believe
- 00:33:00 that if we would have made the decision to put Grace on a ventilator, she would have not died on the
- 00:33:06 13th of October, she would have died a couple of weeks later. Then we were escorted then up the
- 00:33:12 stairs to get out on the main floor where we were exiting by the emergency room. And and that's
- 00:33:18 where our life changed again because the nurse that was escorting us out with grace's tray of

- 00:33:24 belongings, car of belongings. She bent down by me as I was sitting in the wheelchair and she
- 00:33:31 described being with grace throughout the week. And she also then said that her and several of the
