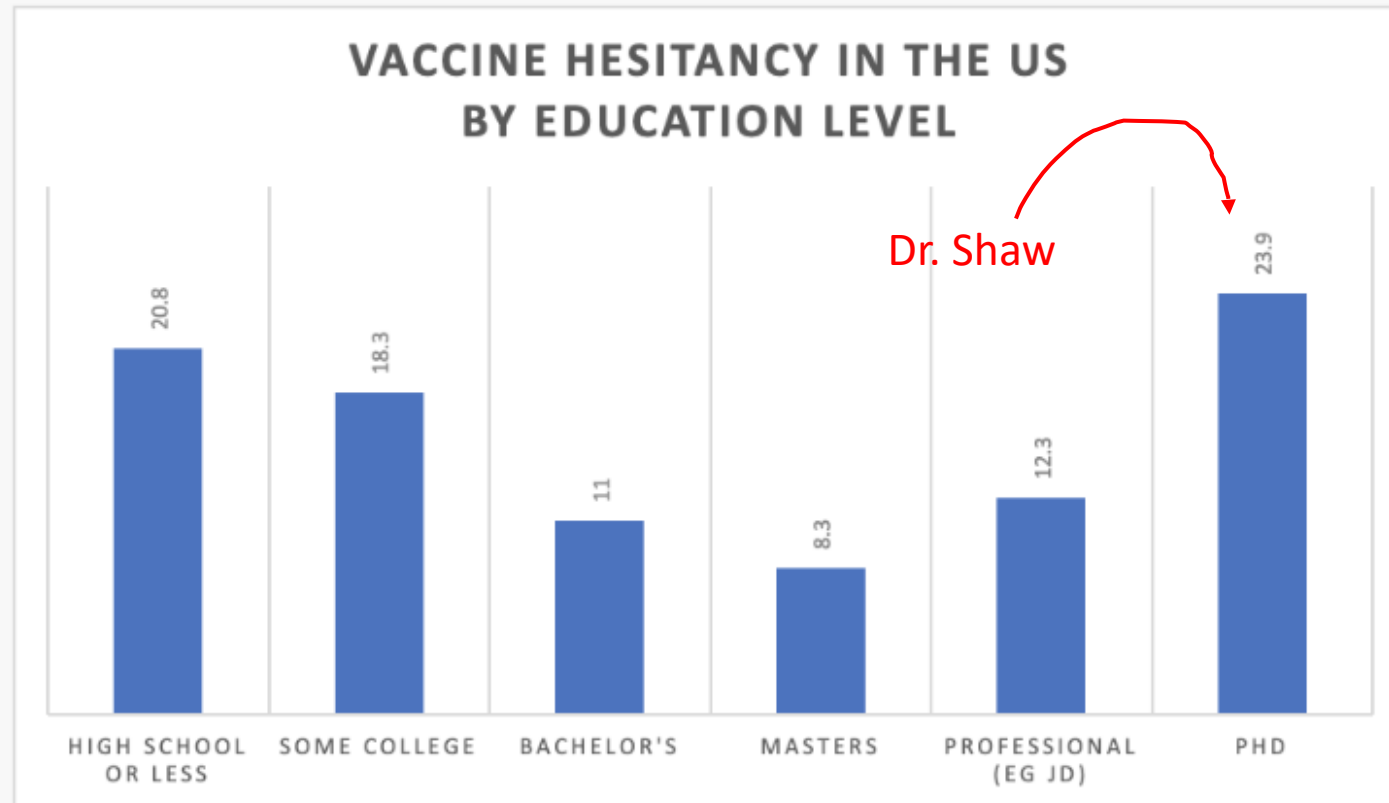

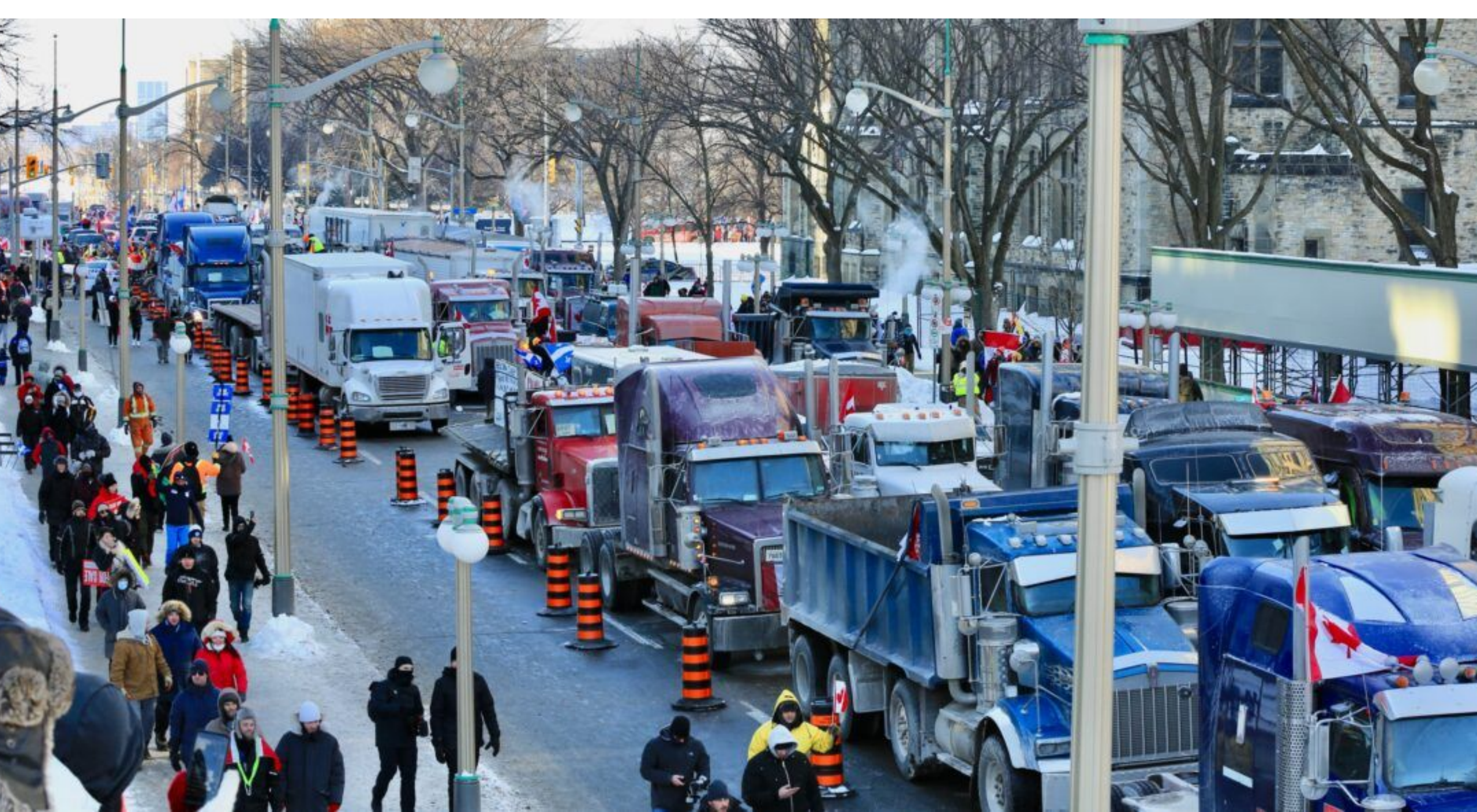

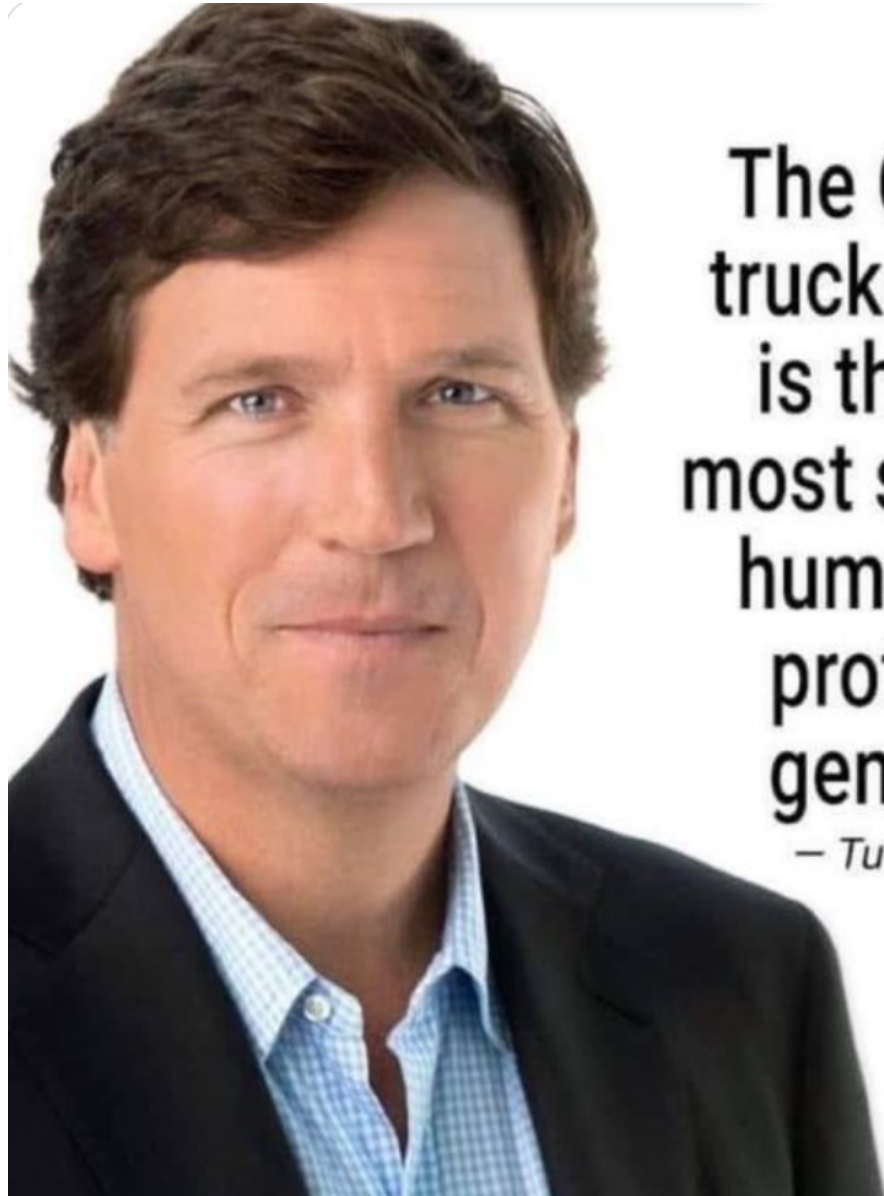
A new study found that the most educated are the least likely to get jabbed

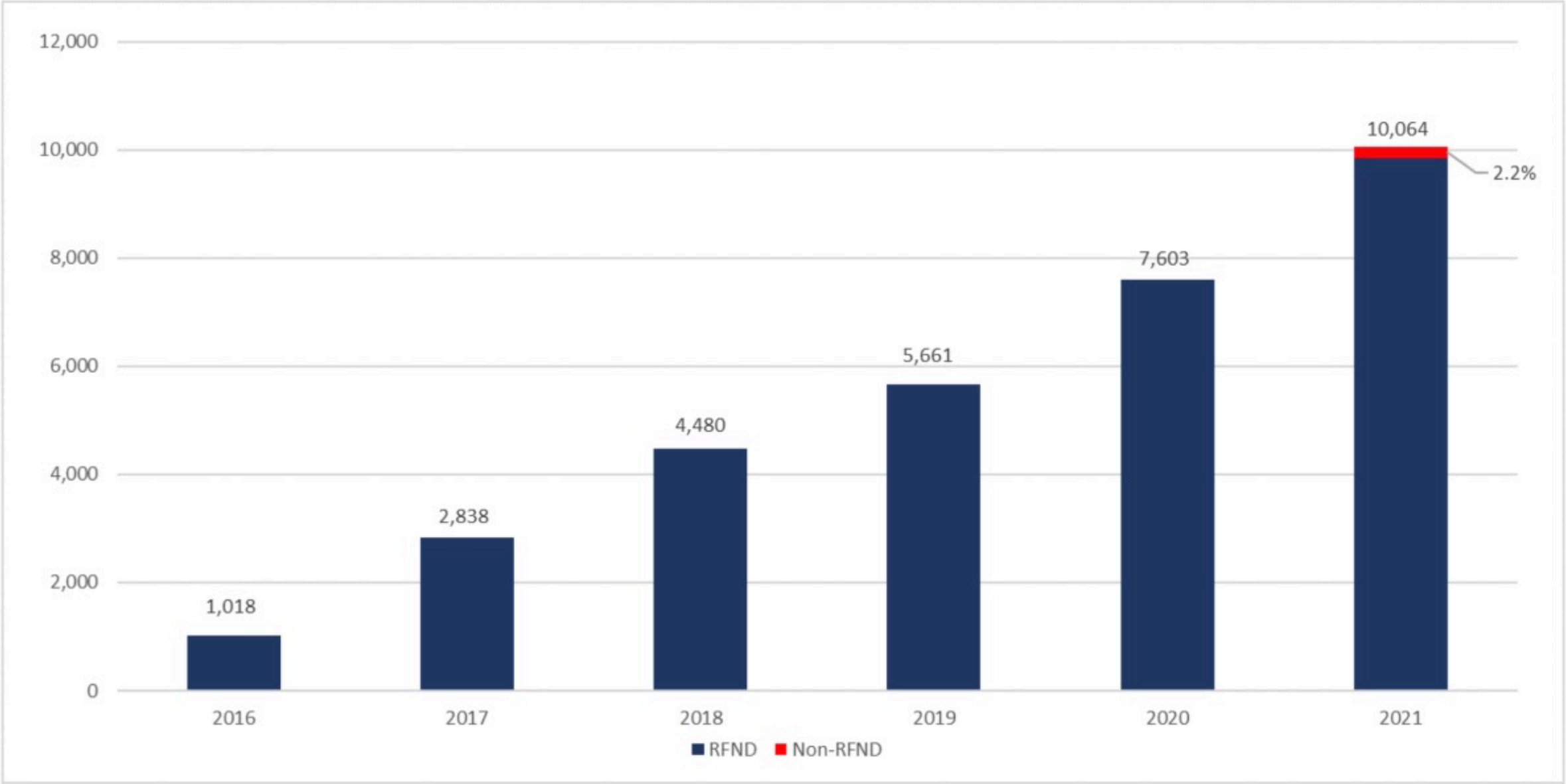

Dispensing Drugs

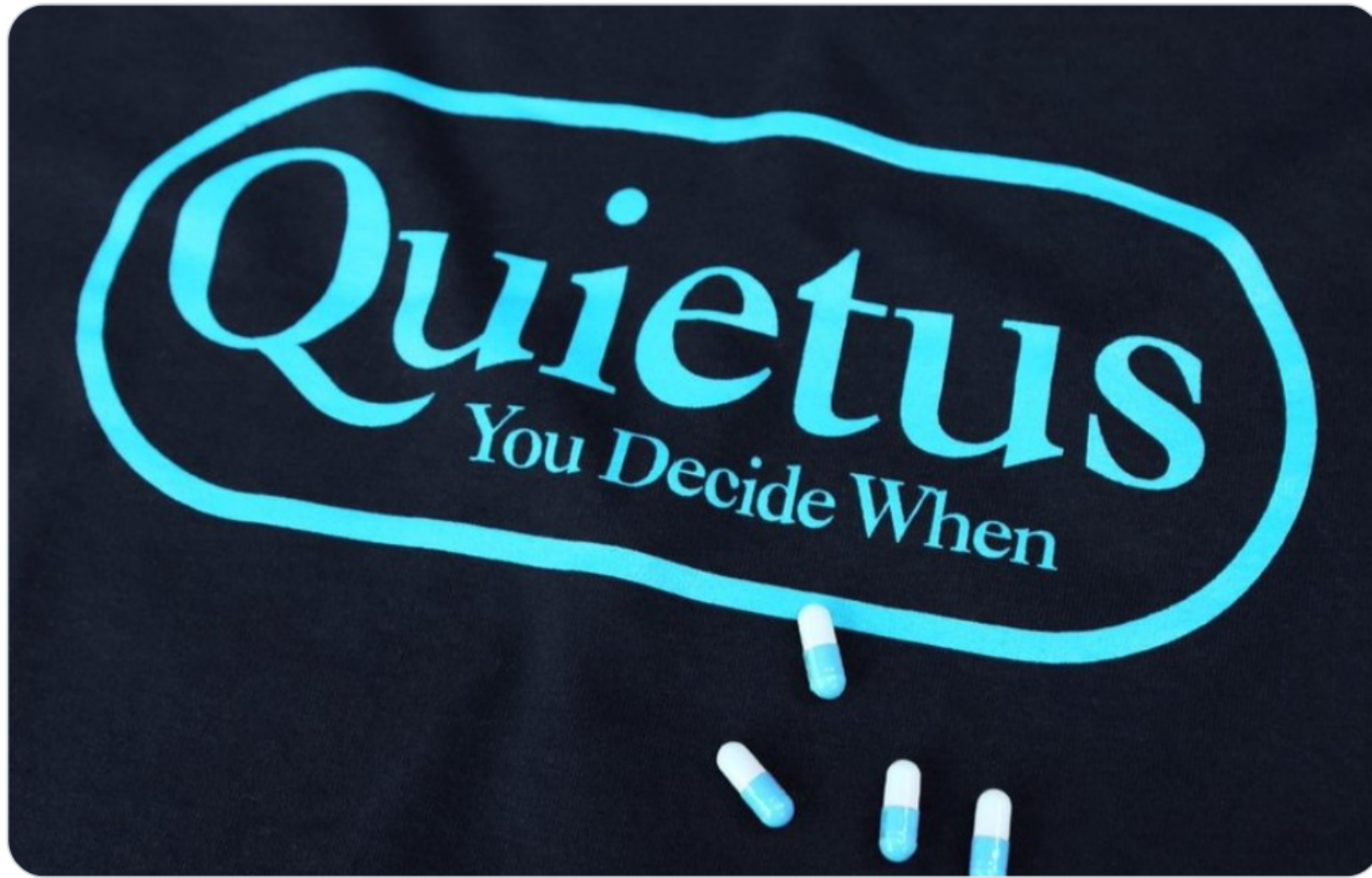
Eligible persons will not have to cover the cost of drugs used to provide medical assistance in dying. In the hospital setting, drugs to administer medical assistance in dying would be dispensed by the inpatient pharmacy and covered by the hospital. For the administration of medical assistance in dying outside the hospital, such as a person self-administering the drugs in their home, drugs would be dispensed through community pharmacies at no charge to the person.

Under federal legislation, clinicians must inform the pharmacist or pharmacy technician that the prescription is intended for medical assistance in dying before a pharmacist or pharmacy technician dispenses the prescription. Clinicians should make arrangements with pharmacies as early as possible to avoid delays in processing a prescription for medical assistance in dying.

With respect to the complaint, I offer several important considerations for the committee:

1. I have not previously known of the complainant in any social, professional or patient capacity.
2. I have never been charged with a criminal offence.
3. [REDACTED]
4. In the time period that the complainant refers to (i.e. early 2021), it was a difficult and stressful time for the medical system including cancer care. We were navigating the complexities of the COVID pandemic to maintain delivery of safe care to our vulnerable patients with cancer, while at the same time keeping our staff safe from the repeated COVID pandemic waves. Patients with cancer are some of the most vulnerable to COVID infection with other jurisdictions reporting twice the infection rates and increased mortality in those with cancer. Through our hard work and diligence, the infection rates of our patients in BC was half that of the general population, yet we maintained full cancer services across the province. [REDACTED]
5. Oncologists in British Columbia have the highest levels of burnout in Canada (BCMJ, 64(7):304-312, 2022), even prior to COVID. In my role, I have emphasized to our leaders and health care workers the importance of stress recognition and management, the availability of resources to help with that, and taken steps to improve our system to deal with burnout afflicting many of our providers and staff.

Hello Drea. Your question regarding an assault that allegedly took place on May 27, 2021 has been referred to the BCPS for response. The BCPS can confirm that a Report to Crown Counsel was submitted by the police in relation to this incident. The charge assessment was concluded on March 31, 2021. The BC Prosecution Service can confirm that no charges were approved. In discharging the charge assessment function, Crown Counsel must independently, objectively, and fairly measure all the available evidence against a two-part test:

1. whether there is a substantial likelihood of conviction; and, if so,
2. whether the public interest requires a prosecution.

With respect to the evidentiary test for charge approval the reference to "likelihood" requires, at a minimum, that a conviction according to law is more likely than an acquittal. In this context, "substantial" refers not only to the probability of conviction but also to the objective strength or solidity of the evidence. A substantial likelihood of conviction exists if Crown Counsel is satisfied there is a strong and solid case of substance to present to the court. If Crown Counsel is satisfied that the evidentiary test is met, Crown Counsel must then determine whether the public interest requires a prosecution.

In this case the assessing Crown was unable to conclude that the charge assessment standard was met and no charges were approved. For more information about the evidentiary test and the public interest component please refer to our policy on charge assessment (CHA 1) in our policy manual.
